ABOUT THE AWARD

The Flinders University Vice-Chancellor's Award for Excellence in Higher Degree Research (HDR) Supervision recognises outstanding achievements across the various dimensions of excellence in supervision: the extent and range of supervision activities; the positive outcomes for students; respect and support for students as individuals; support for students' career development; and broader contribution to the development of supervisory practice within Colleges or across the University.

The recipient will receive a prize of \$5,000 and a certificate. The prize money can be used to support any project related to the recipient's career development or academic work, including conference attendance or research.

ELIGIBILITY

- The student nominating must be a current PhD, professional doctorate or Masters by Research student at Flinders University or was a student in the year prior to the nomination
- Nominations are individual and can not be combined
- All Flinders University research active, academic staff (continuing, contract and full academic status) on the Register of HDR Supervisors are eligible to be nominated
- Applicants must have supervised at least one HDR student (PhD; professional doctorate; and/or Masters by Research) to in-time completion at Principal level at the University in the previous five years.
- Applicants need to have completed the requirements of the HDR Supervisor Development Program within the previous two years as required by the Register of HDR Supervisors.
- Previously unsuccessful applicants are eligible and encouraged to re-apply.
- Award winners will not be eligible for re-nomination. See here for previous award winners.

APPLICATION PROCESS

The Office of Graduate Research (OGR), on behalf of the Vice-Chancellor or nominee and the University Selection Committee, will call for and receive nominations from HDR students.

The student will nominate their supervisor by submitting a nomination form that addresses five questions based on the following criteria:

- The extent and range of supervision activities
- The positive outcomes for students
- Respect and support for students as individuals
- Support for students' career development
- Broader contribution to the development of supervisory practice within the College or across the University
